Anti social behaviour

Wotton cinema and Chipping area -

Overnight after 5:30pm on Wednesday the 16th of October damage was caused to the rear of the cinema in which the outside vent was completely pulled from the wall. This leaving a large hole and making the inside of the building visible. The police 101 sign was also damaged with graffiti.

Window smashed -

Incident 543 – 18th October 2013.

On Friday the 18th of October 11:30 pm the window of the Hong Kong Kitchen in Church street was damaged.

<u> Theft from Salon –</u>

Incident 190 – 18th Oct 2013.

On Friday the 18th of October 2013 two Asian males entered the salon on Church street at approximately 1205pm.

They distracted the staff by enquiring about haircuts before taking items. They were followed by staff up the high street but got away. They were both described as wearing leather jackets. Damage to vehicle -

Incident 56 – 14th Oct 2013.

A vehicle parked on old rectory road opposite the entrance to the building site was damaged on Monday the 14th at approximately 3pm. It had the wing mirror smashed and burgundy paint was left down the side of the vehicle. Witnesses say that at the time a 'Local' fiesta, burgundy colour was seen to be driven at speed along this road. This vehicle contained three young males.

Theft of cable -

Incident 145 – 14th Oct 2013.

During the weekend of 11th October after 4pm and 14th October 8:30am an amount of copper cable 1800m was taken from the Chestnut park area, Old rectory road.

This was taken from a garage in which it was being stored. It was taken from the garage by the removal of the roof tiles and felt being lifted to gain access.

Dog Walkers -

Please be reminded that while walking your pets within the public right of way fields of Kingswood that they should be kept on a lead. This is a preventative measure stopping your pet from straying further into the field away from the path and potentially worrying any animals.

A number of signs have been placed around the area to remind the public of this.

Please be reminded that a public right of way path can only sometimes be a few metres wide and does not give permission for the use of the whole field as an exercise area.
