RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

This is my last letter to you as Rector, part of a succession of last things I am doing as Rector. SHOEBOXES FOR OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD



Just a reminder that Sally Watt will be collecting items to fill shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child again this year. It's not too early to start buying things. How about adding toothpaste, toothbrushes, pencils etc. to your trolley when you're doing your weekly/monthly shop? It helps spread the cost!

Here's a list of the kind of things required:-

Toys: bear, soft toy, tennis ball, finger puppet, jigsaw, yo-yo, building blocks, small musical instrument (no war related items, toy guns, knives etc)

For boys: trucks and cars,

For girls: dolls, clip on earrings, etc.

Educational Supplies: Felt pens, pens, pencils, pencil sharpener, eraser, colouring book, notepad, picture or puzzle book, chalk, pencil case, stickers, etc.

Hygiene Items: Toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, comb, hair clips, bar of soap, flannel, etc. **(no liquids, shampoo, shower gel etc)**

Other Items: Sweets (no chocolate, sell-by date to be at least March 2014), gloves, scarf, sunglasses, cap, hat, bangles, necklaces etc.

The boxes have to be transported from the UK to their various destinations by lorry which is very expensive. Unfortunately, the cost per box has been increased from £2.50 per box to £3. Last year thanks to a donation of money from St Serf's, the ABI Group was able to send 75 boxes to Belarus. Bearing in mind the higher transportation costs, Sally is hoping to fill 50 boxes this year and donations of gifts and money towards the cost will be greatly appreciated.
