	Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Falkingham.
18.62	Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 11 th September 2018
	These were AGREED as a true record of the meeting, and signed as such by the Chair.
18.63	Ongoing issue from the minutes for updating
	18.631 Replacement of felled tree on Watermill Lane: Councillors considered the exact positioning of
	the replacement tree. It was noted that the original planning scheme had the tree nearer the road
	than the actual tree which had been felled; also that various local residents had proposed two separate sites for the new one, and there seemed to be little prospect of consensus. As this is a parish
	council tree being planted on parish council land, it was RESOLVED that a final decision as to placement
	would be made by councillors, bearing in mind factors including but not limited to: the positioning of
	the hedge, private drive, pavement sewer, and former tree; representations from residents; current
	and potential visual amenity; and advice from Harrogate BC.
	Action: Cllrs Bailey, Bryant and Porter to meet on site with Clerk to decide placement
	Clerk to advise Harrogate BC, and obtain a date for planting
	18.632 Millennium Walk: It was noted that a resident has offered to provide the gravel necessary to
	raise the Millennium Walk footpath a few centimetres to prevent flooding.
	Action: Clerk to liaise with Parish Caretakers to progress this.

18.66	Financial Statement and Approvals for Payment

18.67	Budget for 2019-2020
	The parish council considered the draft budget as circulated, with a standstill precept requirement, and RESOLVED to adopt it as the budget for 2019-2020.
	Action: Clerk to inform Harrogate BC of precept requirement
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18.68	Planning Applications and Decisions
	There were no planning matters to consider.
18.69	Parish Working Party The question of a parish working party to plant the daffodil bulbs kindly donated by Harrogate BC was discussed, but councillors RESOLVED that this work, being now quite urgent, would be more effectively done by the parish caretakers. Action: Clerk to contact parish caretakers
18.70	Watermill Lane Councillors considered the possibility of advocating a 20mph speed limit on Watermill Lane / Close. It was noted that this was a decision for North Yorkshire CC Highways, and councillors AGREED to make the department aware of the issue. Action: Clerk to write to NYCC Highways; Cllr Bailey to liaise with North Stainley Primary School

18.721	High Batts Nature Reserve: informing the council that their "In at the Start" project is the National Winner of the Heidelberg Quarry Life UK Community Award. Councillors NOTED their congratulations and invited the group to submit a report to the January council meeting.
18.722	MoP, asking about weed spraying on Watermill Lane.
18.723	Action: Clerk to check that this is included in parish caretaker task list twice yearly NYCC Highways, confirming that the council has no more money left in the Vehicle Activated System (VAS) project. Councillors discussed briefly the possibility of partnering with other councils (e.g. Sharow, West Tanfield), to purchase VAS.
