MAINTENANCE OF PONDS AND COMMUNAL AREAS

The Parish Council has agreed a specification for maintaining the ponds and areas around them. The Parish Council is trying to achieve a more balanced overall effect than there has been in previous years.

The main areas of grass will be cut fortnightly. The banks of the small pond will be cut every month. The island will be tidied up once or twice a year, outside of bird nesting season. The grasses, reeds and plants around the edge of the large pond will be thinned out and tidied in autumn. The trees will be inspected regularly and any necessary work carried out by qualified operatives.

Opportunities for additional planting (including trees and wildflowers) will be investigated. It must be noted that the ponds are infested with an invasive weed, which must be carefully treated and managed once water levels have reduced.
