The Parish Council met on 17th November and 19th January to consider a number of items.

2016/17 BUDGET

The Council's main source of income is the precept money collected through the Council Tax. It has been decided to increase the precept by $\pounds 2,513$ to $\pounds 11,463$ in 2016/17. You will see this increase when you receive your Council Tax bill.

The main reason for this increase is the cost of grasscutting in the village. The 2015 contract cost more than in previous years, but there has been a lot of positive feedback on the quality of the service received.

The Parish Council has therefore decided to enter in to a 3 year agreement with MHS Countryside Management which will ensure continuity of service.
