REVEREND HUGH WRIGHT — OUR NEW PRESIDENT

In 2013 the newly appointed Vicar of St Catherine's, Reverend Hugh Wright, soon discovered that as Incumbent he was also President of the Friends. His presence at our committee meetings has been a tremendous encouragement and we greatly value his enthusiasm and support. Previously he had been the Vicar of St John's Church. Rvde for over 20 years. We have already gained substantially from his considerable talent as a folk guitarist and from his support of our various fund raising



initiatives. He continues to support the PCC's plan for a Community Garden and is assisting David Tamcken in progressing the scheme through the formalities of the Church and Diocese while at the same time seeking to address the misgivings of those opposed to it.

With the responsibility for three churches, Hugh has very limited free time but does enjoy playing with the Ventnor Guitar Club and also with his two grandchildren in Niton, as well a studying for a Masters' degree. His vision for St. Catherine's in the coming years is to continue its dual role of spreading the Gospel of Christ and being a Church for all the people at the heart of the community of Ventnor.

WHAT'S HAPPENED SINCE OUR LAST NEWSLETTER



Our last newsletter was in January 2013.

So what has been happening within the Friends of St.

Catherine's Church since then:-

Well the Committee has changed for members' personal reasons or career changes, as is the way with voluntary groups.

The changes included losing our Founder and President, the Reverend Canon Graham Morris following his departure from Ventnor to continue his work in Rvde.

We also lost the services of Malcolm Young our webmaster and valued member of the Committee.

In March 2014, our Patron, Richard Dickson resigned for personal reasons.

This placed the remainder of the Committee under considerable pressure and we nearly folded at this time. However, after assurances from the new Vicar, the Rev. Hugh Wright (and a letter from the Parochial Church Council in February 2014 saying that the support we had been giving the church was greatly appreciated) we took a vote and decided to continue as a Committee until Phase III, the Community Garden, was completed.

Therefore, it was business as usual and our merry band of volunteers set about fundraising in both 2013 and 2014 – the details of which are given, later on within this publication.

THE COMMUNITY GARDEN THE PLANS ARE CHANGING

For some years now the Friends of St Catherine's Church has been supporting and assisting financially with plans to create a Community Garden around the Church entrance. We had hoped to report that work would soon be starting on this exciting project but now there is a problem. The Church is a listed building and everything has to be approved by the Diocesan Advisory Committee and by English Heritage. Both these organisations are in favour of the scheme but have requested changes to the plans that were submitted. This is in order to reduce the impact on the present churchyard by moving a smaller number of headstones. There will now be a delay to progress whilst new plans are prepared.

However, it is encouraging that there is still optimism that a satisfactory compromise will be reached and the Community Garden will fairly soon, but not as soon as we had hoped, become a great asset to the town of Ventnor.


