BISHOP JOHN'S LETTER

Faith in Troubled Times

hree thousand years ago, a person of deep faith wrote – and the people of God first sang – some of the most beautiful words in history:

"The Lord is my Shepherd, I will not want. He feeds me in green pasture." (Psalm 23: 1,2)

They voice a confident trust that with God as their shepherd, they will not wander: "He leads me besides still waters. He restores my soul." (vs 2 and 3)
With remarkable faith, they declare that whatever life may bring, with the Lord as their shepherd, they will not worry. They sing of God's ever-presence besides them at the darkest times:

"Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me. Your rod and your staff comfort me." (v 4)

We are living through extraordinary and disturbing times. The coronavirus is causing death and deep disruption to our normal patterns of living. Tragedy has included members of the diocesan family. The total lockdown, self-isolation, suspension of public worship and closure of church buildings means that we have had no option but (in the phrase of the Archbishops) "to become a different sort of church".

People have found new ways of caring for each other. Good neighbour schemes have emerged. Our telephones have been busy. Many have shopped for the housebound,

clapped in the street, lit candles, and put teddy bears and NHS rainbow signs in their windows. Many churches have produced deeply moving acts of worship online. I've discovered social media I didn't know existed! We have found new ways of being "together apart" and "holding hands in the Spirit".

I believe as a Church we have rediscovered that our spiritual lives must be rooted in daily prayer and Bible reading at home, not just Sunday worship in church. Jesus is with us wherever we are – we hold on to his promise that he will be with us whatever happens.

I have recently become chair of a small national charity called ReSource whose aim is to help "little, local and ordinary churches" draw on the Holy Spirit for discipleship and mission. The Director has written these helpful words: "Whatever these coming days hold, let's be mindful of one another, alert to the cry of a hurting world, and confident in the love of God, from which nothing can separate us."

May God bless us all.

LOCKDOWN CORNER

HYMN SINGING

Although hymns may seem an immutable part of Anglican worship, this has not always been the case. From the mid-17th century until the mid-19th century, congregational singing was largely restricted to metrical Psalm paraphrases (that is to say, the Psalms turned into a series of four-line verses). Occasionally the versification was so good that it has survived, as a hymn, to the present day. For example, "All People that on earth do dwell" (Psalm 100) and "Through all the changing scenes of life" (Psalm 34). Other examples - the majority, unfortunately - were mere doggerel: "The wicked fools must sure suppose that God is but a Name; This gross mistake their practice shows, since Virtue all disclaim..."

But that is not the worst of it. With organs being rare in parish churches before the 1850s, and with not all churches having the questionable luxury of a band to liven up the singing, the congregation had to rely on the paraphrase being 'lined out' for them. This involved the Clerk reading (or, if he fancied his skill as a musician, singing) the psalm one line at a time, with the congregation repeating each line parrot-fashion. It is related that one Clerk, mounting to his place, found the light to be insufficient. Unintentionally speaking in rhyme and in metre he lamented: "The light in here has got so dim I cannot see to read the hymn". After which the congregation, on liturgical autopilot mode, dutifully repeated "The light in here has got so dim..." IThanks to Graham Corvl

A FOX & HOUNDS RECIPE

to keep you occupied

Sarah Goode of the Fox & Hounds Charwelton has kindly submitted this recipe. She says that she learnt it from an old Irish head chef with whom she worked and this is his take on a pan haggerty. We served it with Guinea fowl but it would work well with chicken or pork. It's an Irish take on a potato rosti and can also be served with a fried equ.

Pan Haggerty

3 large Potatoes

3x carrots

1x parsnip
1/2 Swede

1 small onion

1x turnin

200g Vintage Cheddar

150g Butter

3 Sprigs fresh thyme

Salt & Pepper

* Peel all the vegetables and place the potatoes in a bowl of water to stop them going brown.

* In a large bowl grate all the vegetables leaving the potatoes until last

*Add salt & pepper, chopped thyme, grated cheddar, and melted butter mix well.

*In an oven proof dish spread out the mix and press

* Place in the oven on 170 degrees for about 45 minutes until golden brown and crispy [Thanks to Sarah Goode]

OBERAMMERGAU.

Three Hundred and eighty three years and the world has come full circle. At least, that's how the people in a small village in the south of Germany might view it.

Back in 1633 much of Europe was ravaged by an invisible killer, the bubonic plaque, which was fast approaching the village of Oberammergau at the foot of the Bavarian Alps. The petrified villagers offered up prayers to God, promising that if they were spared this pestilence they would put on a play that recalled the life and death of Jesus. Their prayers were answered, the plaque passed them by and the Oberammergau Passion Play was born, with a vow that it would be performed every ten years in perpetuity as their 'thank you' for being spared. And that pledge has been honoured except on three occasions (twice due to war and once for political reasons outside their control). But what an irony! Now, 383 years later, a new plaque has halted a Passion Play born out of that earlier plaque. But it's only a postponement, as it has been rescheduled for

The experience is not to be missed, with people from all over the world gathering in the purpose-built 4,000 seat Passionspielhaus to share the villagers' act of thanksgiving. The play is performed in two parts, starting in the warmth of the afternoon sun and finishing with the audience looking up at the Cross underneath a starlit sky. The moving scenes (with up to 2,000 performers - from babes in arms to nonagenarians, plus donkeys and a camel - on the stage) can only be fully appreciated by being there. All the actors and orchestral players will have been born in Oberammergau or have lived there for at least twenty years. Eighteen months before the play opens, the men grow their hair and beards, and the learning of six hours' worth of lines, movements and music begins.

The event really is a community giving thanks. Maybe the whole world will give thanks and celebrate when the current plaque is eradicated. But whether our gratitude is celebrated in 383 years' time is another matter


