NEWS! We would like to make all our users aware that from the week commencing Tuesday May 7<sup>th</sup> 2013 our fees will be increased. Since we opened in March 2011 we have avoided increasing our fees to allow people to access and experience this facility. Going forward these changes will allow us to continue to keep our doors open and ensure the facility is being run sustainably. The new fees for self-referrals and private hire groups will be as follows:

(ALL PRICES LISTED INCLUDE VAT)

Self-Referral (fee for anyone entering the pool) - £4

Self-Referral Block Booking (10 X Sessions) - £35

Private Group (Care) - £50

(e.g. care homes or schools etc.) to gain exclusive use of the pool with lifeguard and changing rooms for up to 12 people

Private Aquatic Physiotherapist - £90 per person exclusive use of the pool with lifeguard and with dedicated assistance of an Aquatic Physiotherapist

# Community Leadership Fund Update

St George's is one of the few hydrotherapy pools in the country which is open to the whole community. Every one of any age and ability is welcome. Our users' ages range from 8 months to over 80 years and they come from every ward every ward in the city. Over 1400 local people have accessed the pool, which currently has over 200 clients every week. As well as

individuals, schools, nurseries, care homes and day centres access the pool.

Peterborough's City Councillors have supported the hydrotherapy pool recognizing the positive impact it has on the community and the benefits it can bring to their constituents.

This year the following wards have made donations from their Community Leadership Funds:

### User Profile

Joy and George Kitchen have been coming to the pool from Eye every week for 18 months.

George feels that hydrotherapy has done him the world of good. He no longer wears a support belt for his back and does not need to take painkillers anymore. Before coming to the pool, George tried sessions with a chiropractor but that did not help: within two weeks of coming to the pool, his condition had improved. The spa has also helped



George, he says, "It is the best massage you can get, so gentle on your muscles". Before he started coming to the pool, George could not lift his arms above his head; now he can do this easily.

Joy has hip trouble and her physiotherapist recommended she try St George's. She can do exercises in the water that she cannot do on land. The hydrotherapy is enabling Joy to reduce her painkillers. Because the regular pool sessions help her to manage her condition, Joy has declined to have hip surgery for the time being.

Both Joy and George say they enjoy their sessions at the pool. "It is the best exercise we have and we would recommend it to anyone."
