We thought we'd share some details about our new speech therapists this month

Lauren Drake: Lauren is currently delivering groups for our younger children. She started working for our charity at the beginning of 2014 as a third year speech and language student supporting Ben Bolton in his groups. In 2015 Lauren graduated with a degree in Clinical Speech and Language Sciences (BSc Hons) from Leeds Beckett University; she is an associate of Trinity College London for speech and drama teaching. Lauren also works at Craven College as a specialist support lecturer, working closely with young people who have a range of speech, language and communications needs. Laurens personal experiences have seen her overcome both disability and a communication disorder, meaning she is passionate about equipping individuals with the skills they need to aid or enhance communication and participation. Ellie Coleman: Ellie is delivering our older group sessions. She has 9 years of experience working with individuals, of all ages, with learning disabilities and/or Autism and a range of communication and sensory support needs. Ellie has trained in Intensive Interaction, Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS), Makaton, Attention Autism, Talkabout, Objects of Reference and Multisensory support, the Listening Program, and Lego therapy, and is currently training to become a Regional Makaton Tutor. She currently works at a specialist school in Leeds providing speech and language intervention for individuals and groups, training and mentoring for parents and staff, and whole school strategy development. She has experience working with a wide range of augmentative and alternative communication strategies including high and low tech communication aids.
