AGM	Feedback was very positive with large numbers at both AGM and the following film and discussion. 4 new people expressed interest in beekeeping and there were 3 new volunteers for the Repair Cafe. Some new names were also added to our contact list.	
Steering Committee membership	It was agreed that membership needs to be clarified. Members currently on the Committee are Ann Hill, Delia Kennedy, Peter Bowers, Rosalie Chamberlin, Gill Gale, Richard and Tess Wiltshire, Tim Malyon, Teresa and Tim Pointing, Pat Bell, Kitty Britton, Jeni Lupton and Neil Dennis-Purves. Sally will check whether others who haven't attended recently want to be on the Committee. Also whether Greenham Reach residents all want to be members or to send a representative. When clarified she will then send a definitive list with names of members and their villages to the contact list. If anyone wants to become a member or discuss any ideas they should approach a Steering Committee member via the Sustainable Villages email address and may be invited to attend a meeting. Plastic Recycling	Sally has thanked Felicity for her input at the AGM and expressed our appreciation for the new kerbside recycling being put in place. Tim mentioned that at Uffculme Peninsula are reviewing what is collected because of the drop in oil price. After 1 <sup>st</sup> March the types of plastics collected is likely to reduce. However in future they will collect polystyrene.	Sally will contact Peninsula to see if we should collect plastics at the next Give and Take.
Give and Take	The mayoress, Sue Griggs, has offered the use of a shop in Tiverton for the next Give and Take. Main advantage would be not having to pack stuff up at end of each day. However the market has higher footfall, is more distinct from charity shops and is easier to drop off stuff by car. Richard and Tess will ask the Market Manager – Chris Firth - for same location as previously for either 16, 17 and 18 April or 14, 15 and 16 May. Advertising will be very important. We may be able to use stuff left after Uffculme's Give and Take event and given them things remaining at the end of event. Brendon Energy	BE have been to look at our suggested sites. Westleigh Chapel seems a bit small. Burlescombe school promising but Grade 2 listed so not suitable. Sampford Peverell Methodist Chapel has shrinking congregation - if they needed to sell they are concerned about possible difficulty of selling with solar panels on roof. Holcombe Rogus village hall has tall trees but Richard pointed out there is a plan to remove them – to be discussed at next church meeting. Uffculme - Tim has now identified right person at the school but no response yet. Same with Village Hall. Sally - Ash Thomas has asbestos roof so not suitable.

Junction 27	Local Plan consultation runs to 30 <sup>th</sup> March. MDDC voted not to include allocating land at J27 for development and this is what we are responding to and may want to express support for. Developers may try to get back into plan retrospectively.
