Greenham Reach	James Dexter reported that the residents are happy to work with SV and will send a representative to each meeting. Each of the plots will choose a name. Ruth and Alex's is Steepholding, James' is Wild Geese Acres and Stuart and Helen (moving onto site next week) have not yet chosen a name. James now has a full-time helper called Soraya who has bought a hive of bees with her. "Thousands of new workers"!. They will soon be selling produce at Exmouth Market but are interested in nearer markets. There are difficulties with Wellington, Tiverton and Wiveliscombe. Cullompton and Honiton suggested. They will shortly have an expert coming for 2 days to demonstrate Hempcrete as a building material if anyone would like to be there.
