Welcome	We were welcomed to Greenham Reach by James, Ruth and Helen who had thoughtfully provided a marquee, tea and delicious cake for us.	
Matters Arising	All on agenda	
Give or Take and Plastic Recycling	Very successful event held over three days in Tiverton. Smooth flow of goods in and out. Not much plastic taken. We may use the Tiverton Town Team Pop-up shop for the next Give or Take.	
Repair Cafe	The number of goods for repair was a little less last time so new options for publicity discussed – may include a volunteer with a sandwich board. The insurance costs £30 for each two hour session and this has been covered by grants and donations this year. Derek suggested trying NFU for insurance.	
Parliamentary hustings	Neil, Ann, Pat and Sally went to the event in Dunkeswell organised by the Blackdown Hills Transition Group and covering environmental issues. Jeni and Gill went to a similar event in Tiverton that covered more general issues. Both events were attended by more than 100 people and all found them very interesting.	
Brendon Energy	Sally – her church is interested but cannot commit until other work on their roof is completed.	
Greenham Reach	Helen and Stuart have now moved onto Plot A with their family. The other two plots are preparing to take their produce to Exmouth Farmers market. A crowd funding bid will be launched through Buzzbank soon to improve infrastructure for visitors to the site. The first £4,500 raised will be matched by Funding Enlightened Agriculture. Ruth will let us know when the launch date and the work weekend dates are finalised. The Ecological Land Co- operative that developed the Greenham Reach site are launching a community share offer to fund the development of their second cluster of affordable ecological smallholdings. Beekeeping	All three colonies have come through the winter well. Several new people have expressed interest in joining the group, some who want to be directly involved and some who have their own bees but would welcome support. We agreed we need to clarify what we can offer people who contact us. We will then produce a leaflet with Jeni's help that can be given to those interested. East Devon Forest Garden	Sagara told us about the 3 acre Forest Garden that he started 5 years ago. By substituting the components of a natural forest ecosystem with edible and useful plants you potentially have a food production system that dramatically reduces the work involved in producing food. It is designed to mimic a natural forest and has a vertical dimension so the yield can be stacked vertically. He has also built a 30 foot natural swimming pool and is planning to run various courses e.g. forest gardening, making thermal mass stoves, steam wood bending, solar furnace making. He asked that we save aluminium cans (not crushed) that he can use in making solar furnaces. He would also welcome help with steam wood bending to repair his yurt. He invited the group to visit his Forest Garden and will contact Sally with suggested dates. New events	A seed, seedling, plant and produce Give or Take was suggested and it was agreed that Sally would see if it would be possible to hold this in the Bridgezone Cafe if electricity and water would be available. Peter Smith has offered to give us a free copy of the film 'The Fourth Revolution - Energy Autonomy'. He knows the maker of this documentary about living in a world where 100% of energy is produced from renewables.
