The Parish Council met on 19th January and considered a number of items of business.



JUBILEE TREES

The Parish Council supported proposals to plant an oak tree in each ward of the Parish to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Oak trees, with guards round, will be planted in the next few weeks.

No objections (subject to there being no overlooking issues) were also agreed to two applications for alterations to Church Farm in Sawley to allow the creation of a holiday let.

REPORT FROM SAWLEY ARTS GROUP

In the autumn, thanks to a grant from the Sawley Small Grants Scheme, SAG was able to run three workshops open to all, and an exhibition, "The Hidden Artists of Sawley", at the village hall. The workshops, using clay, felt and fabric collage, were led by local volunteers who passed on their skills and enthusiasm to groups of willing and appreciative locals. Fifty people attended over the three sessions.

The weekend exhibition featured twenty local artists showing work in many forms: dressmaking, woodturning, painting, lacemaking, willow sculpture, needlework and knitting. Over a hundred people came to the exhibition, most delighted by the abundance of artistic talent we have in the area.
