HIGHWAYS

Concerns about poor quality, temporary road repairs will be raised with Highways North Yorkshire.



The Parish Council is corresponding with Highways North Yorkshire on a number of issues which require attention, including the road surface near the junction in Grantley.

The Parish Council was able to secure funding from Harrogate Borough Council to purchase some new equipment for Sawley.

This funding had to be used by the end of June, so it was agreed to buy role-play panels which will fit in the existing play area. These will be installed in the next few weeks.

However it has been suggested that some trim-trail or exercise equipment could be installed in a linear fashion along the far side of Sawley Village Green (next to the hall, parallel to the road).
