Despite a lower number of entries in the vegetable and junior classes there were a good number of entries in the Flowers, Flower Arrangements and Photography classes. Cookery and Preserves held their own, with a high standard of exhibits presented.

Two novelty classes were introduced this year, one for the longest stick of rhubarb and the other for a margarine tub of home-made compost. These classes generated a good number of entries and much interest.

This was the last Show to be arranged by our current Show Secretary, Sheila Cox, and at the beginning of the trophy presentations Chairman Terry Bryant presented her with a bouquet of flowers in thanks for her contribution over the last five years.
