Rebecca Courtman-Safeguarding & Risk

A former volunteer and regular supporter of our equine events Rebecca will be bringing her professional experience to the role of safeguarding and risk. She is a project manager at Disability Challengers, which provides play and leisure time for children and young people with a variety of disabilities. She has extensive training in safeguarding and the barriers of safeguarding when working with disabled children and young people.

Laura Hales—Property & Procurement

A volunteer on Sunday 2 session Laura will be supporting our team of maintenance and gardening volunteers. In addition to the essential day to day work, she will consider

how we use the site to better support our riders and extend our offer to new ones. Laura has experience of the charity sector as a trustee and senior leader. She was Head of Development for Cycling UK, and is currently Chair of African Outreach, a small charity that delivers self-help routes out of poverty in Ghana and Liberia. Laura's current job with the Department of Transport sees her advising Ministers on improvements to local roads.

She is an Operations Director and currently also Regional Director for EMEA in the food safety and supply chain sector. Rider Opportunities 2020

Are you a Dressage Diva, a Countryside Challenger, an Endurance Enthusiast or a Junior Jumper?

In 2020 we are going to focus on providing more opportunities for all our riders, whatever their level, to get involved in all of these RDA disciplines. We also want to maximise the opportunities for those that want to compete both at home and away at RDA Regional and National events.

In the Spring we will be holding our Harold Newton Dressage Competition, back after a year off, and also a Countryside Challenge day. Riders at both these events will be selected to represent Epsom RDA at the Regional events in early Summer. Some may even go on to qualify for the National Championships at Hartpury

College in Gloucestershire in July!

In the Summer we will be holding our second Endurance Month, and entering the National Endurance Competition which challenges groups to see how far they can ride as a group.

Our final event of the year in early Autumn will be a Level I Showjumping event. Riders will complete a course of poles (on the ground – our ponies aren't really jumpers!) - there will be rosettes for all entrants!

Mud, Not So Glorious Mud

This may be only the 24th wettest Autumn recorded in England and Wales, according to the Met Office, but it feels like the recent months have seen relentless rain with our fields and walkways suffering as a result.

The maintenance team have been able to put in some temporary measures by creating new gateways taking the pressure of the muddiest entry points to the fields. However the new field layout needs a long term solution. The Trustees have agreed to invest in the installation of a permanent hard track along Roadside/PI to P4 fields. This is a priority task to be carried out as soon as the contractor is

able to start.

In addition a mud slab system has been ordered to be laid at the entrance to some of the shelters. This should provide a mud free surface for both horses and volunteers as they move in and out of the shelters.
