Parish Letter February 2010

Dear Friends

A Churchgoer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper complaining that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday.

"I've gone to church for the past 40 years, man and boy," he wrote, "and in that time I've heard somewhere in the region of 3,000 sermons, but for the life of me I can't remember a single one of them. So I think I'm wasting my time and the vicars are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all."

This started a raging controversy in the "letters to the editor" column, much to the delight of the publishers. The debate went on for weeks, until someone wrote this reply.

"I've been married for over 40 years now and in that time my wife has cooked for me some 40,000 meals, but for the life of me, I can not recall the entire menu of a single one of them. But I do know this; they all nourished me and gave me the strength to do the work which was set before me. If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise if I had not gone to the church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today."

When you are down to nothing, remember, God is up to something!

Thank God for our physical and spiritual nourishment!

The month of February marks the beginning of the Lenten period. Lent has always been seen as a time of reflection, nourishment and preparation for Easter. Lent is a good time to reflect on many things, our relationship with God and with our neighbour. It's also a time when we can explore the gifts we have been given and see how best we can use them.

In 2009 the Parish received £67,500 from giving in its various forms. Of this £41,000 was given by those on our Planned Giving Scheme, and £10,000 was received from the government under the Gift Aid legislation from our giving in 2008. The Collection Plate brought £10,000, Donations £1,500 and finally £5,000 from the Harvest Gift and Promise Weekends in October.

In a difficult year for the economy this was a welcome outcome and a very sincere thank you to everyone for their generosity.

We wish that this could be the end of our message – but unfortunately, it cannot be. The financial challenges that face our Parish in 2010 are even greater. Every one of us will need to examine our generosity and if possible, review our giving. Any increase we can afford, however small, will make a difference to the Church, both locally and beyond. Also, if you have not already done so, please consider joining our Planned Giving Scheme. Finally, if you can – please Gift Aid it.

How much we give depends on many factors known only to ourselves, and is a very personal decision. However, for those seeking guidance on giving, the Wakefield Diocese has produced a green booklet "Giving money to support the work of the Church" which explores both the spiritual and practical aspects. Copies will be distributed during February.

In the next issue we will look at why we need to be generous and where the money goes.

Report on the DCC Meeting held 15th December

The Vicar opened the meeting with 12 members present with a prayer.

Under Matters Arising from the previous minutes the only reported progress was that redecoration of the Parish Room by Kirklees Community Service people had begun. Matters relating to the organ remain unresolved with our insurers and clarification regarding the legal position of the Parish Room is still awaited from the Diocesan Legal Department.

In the absence of the Treasurer, the Secretary reported that nonbudgeted income was up by about £8,000. This is a result of income from the Gift Weekend (approximately £3,000); the 4 dinners put on in church by Pauline and John Adams and their helpers (£2,000), the Street Market (£1,500 above budget) and increased giving over the year (£1,500). As a result the forecast deficit for 2009 is now reduced to £2,545. Together with the deficit of £4,238 carried over from 2008 this will give a deficit at the end of 2009 of £6,783.

The DCC formally gave consent for a Street Market to take place on Saturday, December 4th 2010.

A report by Andrew Duncan on aspects of fire and safety aspects of the church buildings had been received and circulated to members of the DCC. Thanks were given to Andrew for his contribution. Various aspects of the report were discussed and will lead to a number of minor changes in church.

One aspect which gave rise to considerable discussion was the need for a more organised system to be used by members of the congregation when taking Communion in church. A circulatory system with two queues down the centre aisle returning via the side aisles was preferred and the Churchwardens were asked to 'direct traffic' until the system became established.

On the question of Remembrance, the use of the Book of Remembrance and who should be included in the intercessions

relating to year's mind: it was left that the Group responsible for the subject of Prayer to be set up under the new Parish Plan should consider these matters.

Under Any Other Business a request for use of the church for a concert by Honley Band was considered. The Vicar will obtain details for confirmation at the next meeting. Jane Wardman queried whether a complaint had been made to Kirklees regarding the siting of the new bollards in Church Street blocking the pavement for wheelchair/pushchair users in places. Carol Hirst had already taken the matter up with local councillors. Kenneth Ellis reported a slipped tile on the Parish Room roof.

National Marriage Week – 8 to 14 February

Marriage Week UK celebrates the diversity and vibrancy of marriage as the basis for family life in the UK. It is timed to include Valentine's Day and has been held every year since 1997.

Marriage remains incredibly popular – over 90% of young people in the UK aspire to be married at some point in the future and the large majority will achieve this. Although many people fear that marriages don't last, two out of every three first marriages will last until one partner dies, and one in two second or subsequent marriages will also last a lifetime.

Current research suggests that the enduring stability of marriage results from the commitment that two people make to each other, embodied in their vows, and supported by family, friends, and society at large.

Many couples today however come to marriage to celebrate the stability of their relationships rather than to initiate them, so we see couples marrying later in life, often after living together for a period, and often after buying their home and starting a family.

St George's Church 150 years Anniversary - 28th April 2013

I've been asked to make a start co-ordinating some thoughts and ideas as to how we might celebrate this important date in our church's life.

In the autumn of 2009 two meetings were held, firstly to brainstorm ideas and secondly to put some concrete plans onto a calendar between January 2010 and June 2013.

It was agreed that we needed to arrange some fundraising events to enable us to afford meaningful and significant celebrations when the time draws nearer; that a programme of celebratory events should be drawn up for the period Advent 2012 to Pentecost 2013; that subgroups should be formed to put these various ideas (both fundraising and celebration dates) into practice.

Broadly speaking we hope to arrange events which will be family orientated and have specific activities for children; to organise events which reflect cultural interests – music, flowers, artistic talents, talks, and to consider some activities to do like walks, barbecues and so on.

To make a start on the fundraising front it was suggested that we could hold some 'themed' meals and it is proposed to have the first of these on Sunday 28th February. This is the day before St David's Day and the lunch will have a Welsh 'taste' to it. In an endeavour to particularly include our young families the 'worship' group will look at a form of service very user friendly to that age category. The lunch will be easy (not the Welsh form of 'cordon bleu') but good, will take place in the Village Hall after the service and is open to **all**.

We hope that you will be able to take part in as many events as possible to build up a little 'pot' of money to mark the occasion but also, by participating, to build up our fellowship and enjoyment of working together.

Tickets are available for the lunch and I hope to see lots of you there.


