

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
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# Parish Letter June 2012

Dear Friends

The Bible gives us some suggestions about what makes a good Priest and a good leader of God's people. In the letter of St Paul to Timothy we read of some of the Characteristics required for ministry:

A tall order! And yes, all of these qualities matter.

At times like this it is a good idea to remind ourselves that we are ALL part of the body of Christ and we all have our parts to play in the mission and ministry of our church.

St Paul again in his letter to the Corinthians reminds us that:

Each one of us has a part to play in the building up of the church and as a human body cannot work effectively unless all parts are working together, so it is with the body of Christ, the church.

So whilst we must take time to pray for the right appointment of our new Parish Priest, we must also pray that God will continue to bless and strengthen us in our own ministry and mission, and the strength to continue to grow in strength, faith and love

The church wardens have asked us to pray daily at 12 noon regarding the selection of our new Priest. I would encourage all of us to do this and then we will be confident that whatever the future holds for Honley and Brockholes, we will prayerfully be seeking God's will and purpose for us all.

#### Your Will Matters

Those of you who enjoy day-time television will have noticed that the BBC series "Heir Hunters" is back on our screens. The most remarkable fact from the programme is that two thirds of people die without leaving a Will and millions of pounds simply end up with the government.

Failing to leave your affairs in an orderly state causes your families and friends a lot of trouble and unnecessary expense and making a Will is the only sure way of ensuring that your estate goes where you want it to go.

Wills also become out of date with old addresses and no longer reflecting assets and possessions. Family circumstances, personal needs and wishes also change over time. It is important, therefore, that a Will is reviewed periodically.

The Church of England has always encouraged making a Will as part of Christian stewardship – making sure you are prepared practically as well as spiritually.

If you want advice on making a will the Church of England have a free information pack. To request a copy you can ring the Church's Legacy and Wills Information Line on 08445 870875. You can also visit their website, details of which are provided in the Diocese of Wakefield leaflet – "How you can make a lasting difference to the work of your church".

# Report on St Mary's DCC held on 17th April

Twelve members were present when Chairman, Clive Waind, opened the meeting with a prayer. The first part of the meeting was led by Liz Morton and her two assistants who are responsible for running the Diocesan Children's, Youth and Families Advisory Department. This involved us considering what we do at present to welcome children and young people to St Mary's and to consider ways in which our policies relating to these youngsters might be improved.

Under Matters Arising from the minutes of the previous meeting it was agreed that the PCC be asked to consider obtaining quotations from professional decorators to undertake redecoration of the lounge, dining room and study in the vicarage which are our responsibility.

The need for a set of instructions regarding fire regulations and an order for evacuation of church in case of fire was stressed and should be made available especially to the schools and outside users of the building - with stewards appointed who are familiar with the system to supervise. At the same time it was agreed that the position of Health and Safety Officer which has been vacant for a time should be filled with some urgency.

Kevin Radford reported that a new heater had been installed in the Parish Room kitchen at a cost of £470.

Transformational Planning Group Reports included one from the Pastoral Care Group by Pat Green in which the production of laminated cards containing information welcoming newcomers to church services was a well-received suggestion.

For the Worship Planning Group Jane Wardman reported on a number of special services arranged with their dates.

Bill Kemp for the Community Group outlined plans for a "Treasure Hunt Walk" around Honley and a 'Café Style' Dinner in church in October.

An item on Music in Church introduced by Clive Waind with the object, not of abolishing any aspect, but of strengthening what we already have, led to a proposal for an open meeting on "Music in Church" to be addressed by John Marsh. This received full support from the meeting.

Under 'Any Other Business' John Dean raised the problem of interference on the PA system in church. This is being investigated.

On Outreach Jane Wardman reported that 5 new people had attended the Taize Service in Holy Week as a result of receiving our Easter Cards and Helen Martin had new Sunday Club members due to information contained on the fridge magnets given away at the Street Market.

# Save Honley Library!

On 23rd May members of the Honley Library Book Group were joined by campaigners from the other 6 libraries - Golcar, Slaithwaite, Lepton, Shepley, Kirkheaton and Denby Dale in lobbying councillors at the Town Hall as they met for the first time since the local elections.

They had with them the 2,500 signatures on the petition against removing paid staff from Honley Library and having the library run and staffed by volunteers. Thank you to everyone who signed the petition - a magnificent effort. With the totals from Slaithwaite and Denby Dale we would have been very close to the 5,000 signatures needed to force a full council debate.

The future of the library service is still in being considered. To maintain this valuable community facility, please continue to offer your support to the Book Group and other campaigners.

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
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
