Editor's Spot

Some time ago I received an e-mail form Haydn Davies, one of our members who ministers to several parishes bordering on the A483 near Llanbadarn Fynydd. He expressed concern about the increasing number of serious and fatal accidents involving motorcycles that were happening in his area and wondered if the IAM could do something to improve the situation. He had read that the stretch between Crossgates and Newtown was in the top ten roads in Wales for "racing" these machines.

On the message board of Motorcycle News I did find evidence that the A483 was highly prized as a biking experience. The non-stop bends and lack of police presence were cited as important factors in the enjoyment to be had. There was, however, no reference to racing.

All the IAM can do is train as many motorcyclists as possible to ride in a skilful and responsible way. It is interesting to note here that more motorcyclists than motorists are being recruited into the IAM nationally. MWAM is playing its part through Sean Miles who looks after our m/c section. His first associates are now ready for the test, and we wish them all success.

Skid pan training

I am trying to arrange skid pan training for MWAM members.

We have previously used the Police Skid Pan at Hixon, Stafford and if we use this again we have a couple of options; we can either block book a Saturday which means we're committed to booking a minimum of 9 places with sessions at 9am, 10.30am, 12noon and 1.30pm. The earliest I could arrange a Saturday would be November. However, if members could manage to get there during the week I could book sessions on a more ad-hoc basis once we have identified three people who can go on the same day. Members will have to make their own way to Hixon. Although it may be possible for you to arrange to share the transport once the groups are worked out. I haven't worked out the final figures yet but each place will cost in the region of £45 to £50 per person. It may also be possible to include non-members if you are able to make up a group of three. A session at Hixon consists of three people going in a car with a Police Instructor for an hour and a half; each person takes a turn at driving and they will experience front wheel skids; rear wheel skids and four wheel skids, with instruction on how to prevent and rectify the situation.

We also have another option, there's a company called 'Skids r Us' based in South Wales, the man that owns the company told me that he has a skid car and a big space in which to have instruction. If you want some more information have a look at the following website www.skidsrus.co.uk. Again the instructor takes 3 people at a time for around 2 hours and gives instruction, this costs £150 per car (£50 per person) but if we have 12 people willing to go on the same day and they book via MWAM there will be a bit of discount.

Please let me know what you prefer either by emailing me or by completing the enclosed form and returning it to me – see contact details on last page. As it will take time to co-ordinate the sessions I would like to be able to get on with it as soon as possible, so I would appreciate getting your responses back by 30th September 2006 at the latest so that I can make any necessary bookings and get back to you.
