# **Annual General Meeting 2008**

The 4th Annual General Meeting of Mid Wales Advanced Motorists was held on Saturday 8th March 2008 at The Bracken Trust, Llandrindod Wells. This was attended by 20 group members and apologies were received from 14 members, 3 associates and 3 IAM personnel.

Our chairman Francis Torrens addressed the meeting and outlined the achievements of the last year and the challenges for the future. The Secretary Geoff Smith reported on the success of our associates and observers. He also commended the group newsletter, Mid Wales Matters and the web site to members. The audited group accounts for 2007 prepared by Mandy Giordano were approved and elections were held for our officers, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer together with those for new committee members.

For the first time we now have a full complement of committee members.

#### **Motoring Milestones**

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, 1896, poor Bridget Driscoll, a pedestrian, was the first person to be killed in a road crash.

Hit near Crystal Palace by a car apparently travelling at just 4mph, she was the subject of an inquest at which the coroner hoped that "such a thing would never happen again". Today more than a million people die every year on roads across the world.

Before June, 1935, you could jump into a car on your 17<sup>th</sup> birthday and hit the road. The first successful test candidate was a Mr J. Beane. The test lasted 30 minutes and included an emergency stop, a three point turn and reversing round a corner. Today there are 4 possible manoeuvres, a separate theory test, a computer-simulated hazard perception test and fuel-saving "eco-driving" techniques.

#### Are we making progress?

It looks as though motorists are fast learners! Speeding fines have more than halved in the UK over the past year. The figures come from major hire firm National Car Rental.

The company says its customers normally clock up thousands of penalties every quarter, but the number of tickets it has received dropped by 52 per cent over the last 12 months.

And it's not only speed cameras that motorists are dodging. Our table shows that National has also recorded a 48 per cent decrease in the number of bus lane penalties issued to its customers between the third and fourth quarter of 2007.

There were significant drops in parking, congestion charge and other general traffic offences – such as talking on a mobile phone at the wheel – during that period, too.

National bosses claim the shift is down to new legislation which could land reckless business drivers in trouble with their employers. Operations manager David Alexander explained: "When you speed in a rental vehicle, the police inform the hire company via the DVLA, and it will then tell your boss. So your job could possibly be at risk."

Allowing for setup from 9am we have four periods and will therefore need a minimum of 12 persons for each event. This is a good opportunity for our members to support the group by talking others who share their enthusiasm for driving and riding. We need both motorcyclist and drivers and you will be provided with an IAM shirt for your efforts.
