Observer Training

Following the resignation of our Chief Observer the future of Observer Training was discussed at a meeting of observer held in November 08. It was agreed that we divide our region into initially two areas. This would enable area observer meetings to be organised independently to reduce travelling time and costs and also encourage attendance. Humphrey Morgan will take on the role of the Southern Area Observer Co-ordinator and David Leppard will perform this role for the Northern Area. These co-ordinators will arrange for local driving meetings with observers in their area. It was also agreed that we would continue with 'static' meetings every 4 months and these would be held at the Bracken Trust. Both Car and Motorcycle Observers would be invited together with our IAM Examiners and IAM Staff Examiner if available. The position of Chief Observer will need to be filled and until this appointment can be made Geoff Smith will act in this role.
