Makes good wine as well.....

Mention dandelion and a shudder wriggles down most gardeners' spines. Scourge of lawns, borders, patios and allotments, they're a major reason why we spend a fortune on weed killer or hours bent double, extracting their thong-like roots. Now, a species of Russian dandelion is set to become one of the most important plants on the planet, propping up civilisation with rubber made from the glutinous, milky sap found in its roots.

In July this year, Indian-Dutch company Apollo Vredestein rolled out the first prototype tyres produced from European-grown rubber. If tests go well, they hope to start full production in 2015. The dandelion, Taraxacum kok-saghyz (TKS), is one of three plants currently being investigated by various international consortia, made up of government agencies, big business and scientific research establishments, locked in a multi-million pound scramble to find alternatives to natural rubber.

Original thinking!

Councillors in rural Ireland have come up with a novel way of tackling the problem of drink-driving – by making it legal. The plans backed by Kerry county council, in south-west Ireland, would allow police to issue permits that exempt some people from drink-driving limits.

Councillor Danny Healy-Rae, who proposed the motion, said the new rules should apply to "older people" who live in isolated areas. He argued that current laws regulating drink-driving were forcing an older generation to stay home. "All the wisdom and all the wit and all the culture that they had, the music and the singing, that's all being lost to the younger generation because these older people might as well be living in Japan and Jerusalem. I see the merit in having a stricter rule of law for when there's a massive volume of traffic. But on the roads I'm talking about, you couldn't do any more than 20 or 30 miles per hour and it's not a big deal."

The motion was passed at the end of a long meeting when 12 councillors were absent. The council will now call on the Irish justice department to implement the change. But it is unlikely that the council will be able to force a change in the law. The idea was branded "unthinkable" by road safety campaigners, and the Mayor of Kerry, Terry O'Brien, called it "incredibly dangerous." A number of councillors who approved the measure, including Mr Healy-Rae, are pub owners, and as such could benefit from the rule-change. Mr Healy-Rae denied that this had influenced the vote. Clearly they're just lovers of ageing wiseacres and balladeers!

Membership Renewal 2013

We thank the 80% of members who have already renewed they membership for 2013 and for their continued support. Annual subscription for group membership is due on 1st January each year and renewal notices were sent out at the end of last year requesting payment of the £10 fee. Over 70% of our membership now pay their subscription by banker's standing order and this is the preferred method to ensure that membership does not lapse. If you have not received your membership renewal notice and MWAM membership card for 2013 please let the membership secretary know and these will be sent to you again. Members are also asked to return the 'Renewal of MWAM Membership' form in the addressed envelope provided. This contains the details held on each member and affords the opportunity to amend any of these. This form should be returned to the membership secretary even if all details are correct as its primary purpose is for each member to declare that they are current members of the IAM. They are asked to enter the expiry date of their IAM membership from their IAM membership card (not MWAM) on this form. Unfortunately unless you hold a current IAM membership you are not eligible to be a member of local group. However, you can transfer your membership to that of Group Friend at the same annual rate of £10. This classification is intended for those who may wish to support a local group whilst not willing to commit to either IAM membership or advanced driver or rider training. If you wish to transfer to the Group Friend class of membership please indicate this when you return your form. Any member who has let their IAM membership lapse and has paid their MWAM subscription will be transferred to a Group Friend unless they

War on speeding motorists

Drivers will be confronted with a further speed camera onslaught as part of a raft of measures to slow them down, a report revealed.

Lower limits and more road humps, chicanes and other 'traffic calming' measures are also contained in the guidance given to councils.

Ministers are calling for many more 20mph limits in residential and urban areas, and for the riskiest rural roads to be slashed from 60mph to 40mph.

They also signalled a significant role for a new generation of 'average' or 'time over distance' cameras, particularly on rural roads.

Unlike traditional speed cameras, which capture a driver at a specific spot, these devices take a photo of a car and its number plate in one location and then, up to a mile or so down the road, take a second picture and work out the average speed between the two points. If this is higher than the limit, a speeding ticket is automatically issued to drop through the driver's letterbox.

Such cameras are often used to police motorway roadworks or on so-called managed motorways with variable speed limits.

The Department for Transport report calls for the cameras to have much wider role in 'calming' traffic following evidence they slash fatalities and seriously injuries on the road by more than two thirds, or 69 per cent.
