INSIGHT INTO 2017

As we enter 2017, many of us made New Year resolutions – and a great many will break them within days of writing them down! However at IAM RoadSmart you will see that we carried out our 2016 resolutions, and in 2017 we will be carrying on that good work.

Next month we will be launching our bite-size driving modules, which will allow customers to try out a one-off assessment covering a number of different aspects of driving. Those modules, which will last between 60 and 90 minutes each, will cover the following:

- Vehicle management
- Overtaking
- Parking and manoeuvring

These will all be carried out by approved ADIs. There is no obligation for the customer to have any more assessments with us – but we are very hopeful that when a new customer to IAM RoadSmart tries one of these, they will be encouraged to embark on the Advanced Driver Course and sign up to a local group.
