

We are still waiting for the electricity pole at Barnetts Hill to be replaced in order that the Vehicle Activated Sign that the Parish Council has paid for can be installed and become operational.

Are you a Responsible Dog Walker ?

During the summer months hundreds of people walk our local footpaths, ranging from local families to visitors from abroad.

Also more of our children than ever are using the Recreation Ground daily.

Nobody wants to step in dog poo, but more and more reports of it are coming in.

Dogs should not be on the Recreation Ground at all. There are clear signs saying so.

If you walk your dog anywhere else in the village, please carry a polythene bag with you, and if you have to use it, either drop it into the dogbin at the Maltings or doublewrap and dispose of it with your waste.

It is time to name and shame those who cannot be bothered to clear up after their dogs.

Did you know ?

Toxocariasis is a rare infection caused by roundworm parasites. It is spread from animals to humans via their infected faeces.

The roundworm parasites live in the digestive system of dogs, foxes and cats and produce eggs, which are released in the faeces of infected animals and contaminate soil.

If someone accidentally eats small particles of contaminated soil, they may develop toxocariasis
