It seems a shame at this time of year to be using the Periodical to draw attention to the way some residents are abusing the facilities provided for them at the expense of the parish, but as a response to numerous complaints please note the following:

<u>Dog Bins:</u> These have been erected for the use of those who need to dispose of their "dog-poo" bags which have been used while they were out exercising their dogs. PLEASE do not use them to dispose of dog waste from your garden. Some residents have been trying to squeeze large bags of waste into these small bins. They are not for this purpose.

<u>Domestic Waste:</u> This should go into your own wheely-bin and nowhere else. The bins for public use at the roadside are for litter which would otherwise finish up on our streets. Residents seen throwing their domestic waste into these bins, or into empty properties, or hedgerows or woods will be reported for fly-tipping.
