The Memorial Hall

The discovery of the fact that the roof was in a poorer state than preliminary inspections had revealed has led to an opportunity to reconsider the installation of photovoltaic units as part of the additional roof work now agreed. This will further the aim to build a truly environmentally-friendly community centre for Peasmarsh.

Now that the Christmas and New Year breaks are over we expect work to progress rapidly, and hope that the new hall will be ready for a grand opening some time in June 2013. The Hall Committee would like to express their thanks to all those from Peasmarsh and beyond who contributed to the collection box at Jempson's.

Work at the Church

It was lovely to see a church full of children and adults for the Candlelit Carols and the Christmas Day morning Service. The next "Family Service" in Peasmarsh Church will be at the Feast of the Presentation (or "Candlemas) which will be celebrated at 10am on February 3rd. During December re-tiling work was completed on the north slope of the roof, thanks to funding from FOPPC, (the Friends of Peasmarsh Parish Church).



On January 16th a firm of organ builders called "Organ Design Ltd" will start work to complete the organ which has been waiting so long in an unfinished state. They expect the work to take about a month. Before Easter we should be able to celebrate a "whole" organ in our church

The new fingerpost for the junction of Church Lane with Dew (Barline) Lane has been completed and should be erected shortly.
