The 2nd Rye10 race will be taking place on Sunday 26th May at 10:00 am Runners will be registering at the Cock Inn and the race will start at the entrance to Jempson's car park.

The 10 mile route is via Tanhouse Lane turning into Starvecrow Lane, into Moore's Lane, along Furnace Lane, turning right at Calveslodge Wood into Horseshoe Lane, then back to Starvecrow Lane and the finish at Jempson's.

Peasmarsh Revived

Peasmarsh Memorial Hall Refurbishment Project

Many residents are beginning to ask about the Memorial Hall and how soon it will be reopening.

Considering the sort of winter we have had it is hardly surprising that completion has now been put back a week and that it is now expected that work will finish at the end of June.

The builders have done a splendid job, working in all kinds of bitter temperatures.

The project manager reports that the weatherboarding is nearing completion and the guttering shortly to be fitted; also the internal doors. Decoration is progressing, ceilings and external joinery to be completed and walls to have a penultimate coat.

Floor battens are to be fitted in a fortnight, then under floor heating, then wooden flooring.

As soon as possible you will all be invited to a grand opening ceremony.

Before this happens, the Hall Management Committee will invite current and potential hirers to come and have a look at the new layout.

A second DOGBIN is soon to be installed on the other side of Main Street, close to the path which runs past Farleys Way to School Lane. It is hoped that this will reduce dog fouling along the path itself, and encourage others to put their dog-poo bags into the bin instead of decorating the hedgerows.
