4. If you would like a free crime prevention survey, please contact your local team on 101.


Working together we can make a difference.

With most of their sessions taking place in August and October the team recorded 279 offending vehicles with 8 doing excessive speeds.

Special mention must be made of Peter Lamont who has been the driving force behind the Community Speedwatch. Not only has he arranged the sessions but he organises the equipment, records the data collected and analyses the results and gives everyone a feedback, so a big thank you to Peter.
