Tribute to Audrey Dent

It is difficult to do justice to Audrey's contribution to our village. She was active in so many areas, and her generosity with her time and her energy was unbounded. She was already a member of the Hall Committee (Old Hall) when I joined at the beginning of this century. She went on to act as Secretary for the sub-committee which published the 2006 Parish Plan and subsequently managed the planning and building of the new hall in co-operation with the Parish Council. The little "garden" was her particular preserve and flourishes colourfully throughout the year with minimum maintenance thanks to her thoughtful design. She was also a managing spirit behind the popular fund-raising quizzes, particularly the Ploughman's supper with her unique cole slaw. Until its sad closure she was a lively member of the W.I. organising regular village "clean-ups" which dealt with the quantities of rubbish which had accumulated. A valuable member of the "Ladies Choir" she not only acted as its treasurer, but took on the thankless task of librarian for many years, collating and organising a vast quantity of music. She loved singing and participated with enthusiasm in all its activities. Largely unseen in the vestry, she was the Sacristan at Peasmarsh Church for many years, preparing for the services and clearing up afterwards. She was a wise and practical voice on the committee of the Friends of Peasmarsh Parish Church, and officiated in the "Stable" (in its old form and in its wonderful re-incarnation in which she played a considerable part) where she gathered a team to provide and serve food and drink for Flower Festivals and other church events, and was the pivotal spot for the refreshments for the PCMF. Quietly content to undertake the jobs nobody else wanted, many of us will remember her with her sleeves rolled up, trudging round to the stable toilet with a mop and bucket, a self-imposed task which she carried out in all weathers for many years.

Thank you Audrey, for all of this.
We miss you.....so much.
