BOUNDARY REVIEWS

For as long as many of us have been voting locally (1977?) Peasmarsh has been in the District of Rother, the County of East Sussex, and the Westminster Parliamentary Constituency of Bexhill & Battle. Periodically the boundaries of these areas of government are reviewed (the main criteria of these reviews seems to be to make the numbers match!)

Did you know that new District and County Boundaries were finalised this summer? You may be surprised to learn that we shall no longer be part of a "Rother Levels" ward with Beckley and Northiam. No, we are to be part of "Eastern Rother", along with Iden, Camber and Rye Harbour – all wards within Hastings and Rye Constituency!

However, when we come to County Council Divisions, which will all be up for election next May. we are back in Northern Rother Division with Beckley, Northiam and Robertsbridge and other Parishes within Bexhill and Battle Constituency.

Confused? It gets worse!

The Boundary Commission appears to have started its current review of the South Eastern Parliamentary Constituencies somewhere west of London, and worked its way round anti-clockwise and along the south coast. Many of our westerly neighbours seem fairly satisfied with what is proposed for them. But when they got to Bexhill & Battle and added a fair chunk of Wealden to it (apparently doing away with the rest of Wealden) there were a lot of bits and pieces left – remnants with nothing in common, large unrelated areas of land in the counties of both Kent and East Sussex, stretching from Crowborough to Cranbrook and from Burwash to Tenterden, and covering no less than 4 local authorities.

This is our new "High Weald" Constituency.

With the best will in the world in terms of administration it is an unworkable disaster. In terms of the electorate it reduces our "voice" in local government to a whisper.

There is just time to make the Commission think again, but **this first 12-week consultation period finishes on December 5th**

We need everyone in Peasmarsh to "have their say" before this date, and tell the Commission this new constituency **cannot work** and they should show some respect and consideration for the electors who live in this area.
