The Supported Lodgings Team are looking for residents with space in their home who would be prepared to offer accommodation for a young person aged 16-18 who needs accommodation and the presence of an adult in their lives to help them become independent. There are an increasing number of young people who, for one reason or another, cannot live with their family. As well as having a spare room, providers, who can be couples or single people, need to be resilient and non-judgemental, with time to give to a young person, both emotionally and practically - Do you feel you could support a young person to become independent?.
