#### RECREATION GROUND

Thank you to those who came to discuss the Recreation Grounds on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. Those present were able to identify the beginnings of a committee and made the following decisions:

- 1. to study Active Risk Management Services report and clarify which risks actually need urgent attention. (ARMS were due to undertake the 2011 inspection the week beginning 27.6.11)
- 2. to undertake temporary repair on fencing
- 3. to approach firms supplying fencing for estimates on replacement fencing and to seek funding.
- 4. to call an Annual General Meeting for Thursday July 21st. 7.00pm at the pavilion.

5.to seek the Primary School's approval to conduct a survey of the children to find out which recreational activities would most appeal to them, and subsequently to take steps to arrange a "taster day" on the grounds during the summer holidays.

If you are a keen sportsman or woman, or your children enjoy sport it is more than likely that you now go outside the village for training or to join a team.

Please try to find the time to come to the meeting on July 21st so that we can have the benefit of your experience and enthusiasm.
