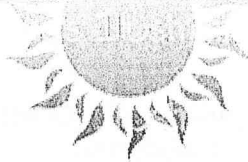

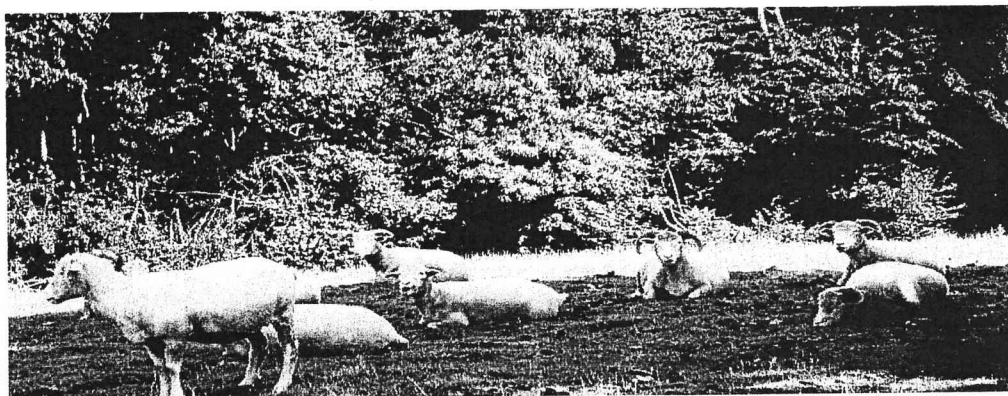
*The Sing for Fun Concert was a

### The Playspace Project.

As most of you already know we have to take urgent steps to repair and renovate the playspace at the Maltings.

Thanks to a generous response to our appeal earlier in the year we have enough money to undertake the most essential repairs, and this is already under way. We are particularly grateful to the Cock Inn for their contribution, and this week Yvonne Jordan and her "Sing for Fun" Group put on a delightful afternoon's entertainment, with the help of a small and enthusiastic choir from Peasmarsh School, and raised another £170 for the project.

It is a shame that money raised for improvements is now having to be spent repairing systematic and wanton damage to the grounds (notably the fence around the playspace) inflicted by older youths from Peasmarsh who don't seem to care that they are destroying a fence erected to keep their younger brothers and sisters safe. Others are lighting fires in the waste bins where they are burning plastic which produces toxic fumes.

If you know who these young people are, please name them and shame them – or take a picture of them in action.

Ideally we would like to build a new playspace of more modern design and durable material (hopefully vandal-proof) for the new generation of "toddlers" with the possible addition of some exercise machines for the elderly

This would require more money than we can raise within the village – we shall of course continue to raise funds locally - but there are charities that we could approach for funding.

However, we cannot do that unless we have a properly constituted Recreation Ground Committee with representatives from user-groups and other interested bodies in the village, especially those with young children or those specifically interested in children's sports activities. Once again, we are asking anyone prepared to give some time and effort to this project to put their names forward so that we can start to make some progress.
