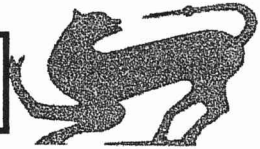

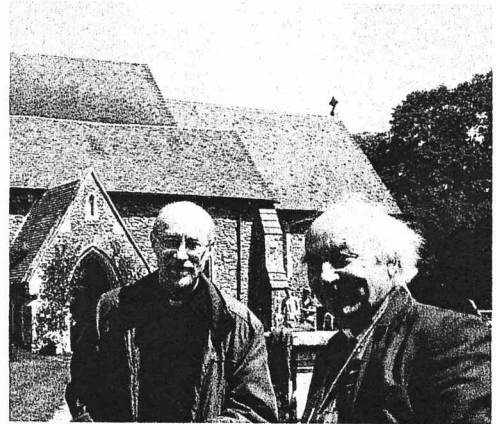
## June 2015

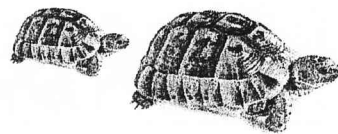
Please note that this year this service will start at 11am - not the usual Sunday morning time of 10am.
