In addition to trying to keep you informed we do try to bring to your attention some of the more anti-social things that Peasmarsh would be better without:

- Dog poo. Despite the bins, some dogwalkers still do not pick up after their dogs and persist in walking them across the playing field or dispose of their “Poo-bags” by simply leaving them by the hedges - Rother District Council has confirmed to the Parish Council that provided the "Dog Poo" is properly bagged and tied it can be deposited in public bins

- Vandalism. Broken windows and uprooted goalposts. This all costs money which could go to improvements instead. Admittedly accidents do happen with footballs, but recent behaviour (captured on video) indicates that some of our young people have a lot to learn about social responsibility.

We are fortunate to have in Peasmarsh a splendid Memorial Hall, extensive Recreation Grounds, a first class Primary School, an amazing Church which has regular services, a large supermarket with a petrol station and other facilities which I am sure you can add to this list. We also have a number of volunteers who manage some of these, but it is a diminishing (and ageing) list and we badly need more residents to get involved.
