Peasmarsh Matters

Possible Compensation

From 27th to 29th July 2018 properties in Peasmarsh suffered a loss of gas supply due to a low pressure problem in the area which resulted in Southern Gas Network (SGN) having to visit individual properties to ensure that the supply was disconnected at the property and once the problem had been resolved re-visiting to reconnect. Anyone who was affected by this disconnection may be entitled to compensation for every 24 hours of disconnection and this compensation (from SGN) should have been paid automatically to the gas provider (ie British Gas). Residents are advised to check their bills from July 2018 until now to ascertain if they have received any compensation (via their provider) and if you have not received this compensation then you will need to contact your provider **NOT SGN** to request compensation - you may wish to word your request along the lines below

"From July 27th until July 29th 2018 my gas supply was disconnected by SGN due to a drop in pressure in the Peasmarsh area of East Sussex and I understand that I may be entitled to compensation from SGN for this disconnection. As you are my provider any compensation should automatically have been sent to you and it appears that I have yet to receive it"

Please note: Only residents on mains gas at the time of the disconnection are eligible for any compensation

Rother District Council and Parish Council Elections

On Thursday 2nd of May 2019 voting will be taking place to elect your District and Parish Councillors for the next four years. If you have not already registered to vote then you will need to do so by 9th April 2019 and if you wish to stand for election then nomination papers must be submitted on any working day from 10am to 4pm between Wednesday 27th March and 4pm Wednesday 3rd April. They need to be submitted by hand to the Town Hall Bexhill-on-Sea as any nomination forms sent by post will be rejected.
