Site Allocations - Neighbourhood Area and Plan

Rother District Council will shortly be consulting on a proposal to allocate a site in Peasmarsh to enable 45 new homes to be constructed as part of its Development and Site Allocations ("DaSA") Local Plan which is in response to government's housing targets. This proposal and the parish council's response will be discussed at the next meeting of the parish council on Tuesday 6th November at 7.30pm in Peasmarsh Memorial Hall. There will also be a proposal by the parish council to begin creating a neighbourhood area with a view to ultimately having a neighbourhood plan for Peasmarsh which will go some way to giving residents greater control on any future developments in the village. If you would like to help shape the future of Peasmarsh then please come to the meeting.
