Parking in School Lane

Concerns have been raised about the large number of cars parked half on the road and half on the footpath at the Horse and Cart end of School Lane. The footpath is quite narrow and at this end is only on the Horse and Cart side of the road leaving pedestrians no other choice, if the footpath is blocked, but to walk in the road.

Clearly this is very dangerous for everyone particularly for the children who are going to and from the primary school but also for wheelchair and mobility scooter users and adults walking with prams and pushchairs. When parking in School Lane could drivers please give consideration to the needs of pedestrians and avoid parking on the footpath if at all possible or leaving sufficient room for pedestrians.

It is worth noting that although it is not illegal (outside of London) to park cars on the footpath if your car is reported or seen by a police officer and judged to be either in a dangerous position or causing an unnecessary obstruction you could receive a Fixed Penalty Notice
