Peasmarsh Memorial Hall Refurbishment Project

Work is expected to start on the Memorial Hall on Monday October 22nd.

Most of the regular activities now taking place at the Hall will take place at the Pavilion after October 20th until further notice. This will include the Brownies and Guides, Zumba and Dog training.

Sing for Fun and the new Youth in Motion programme will be starting up at the pavilion on the dates advertised elsewhere on this leaflet.

On Saturday October 20th there will be a **GRAND CLEARANCE SALE** from 1.30pm at the hall. Everything must go, so come along and see if you can pick up any bargains.

It will not be possible to make bookings for daylight hours on a Saturday due to Sports fixtures.
