## Pier to Pier - 22nd May 2011

The Pier to Pier race is one of the more popular runs in the region with 777 finishers this year, their second largest entry. The race starts on the beach at South Shields pier and follows the beach and coastal footpaths to finish about 7 miles later near the pier on Roker Beach in Sunderland. It always takes place on a Sunday in the middle of May depending on the tides.

The day started with bright sunshine and blue skies with a gentle breeze but the wind soon picked up and the clouds arrived. We all huddled together like penguins at the start to try and keep out of the biting wind and were pleased when the whistle blew at 10am to set us on our way.

Fortunately the tide was out and the over half mile of beach start was reasonably firm underfoot. The strong headwind coupled with running on sand was a tough start for some competitors.
