CALLS TO POLICE

During period 25th April to 30th May 2017, PSoS received **771** calls to incidents in Alloa:

- Beat A01 156 calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 307 calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 183 calls for town centre
- Beat A04 125 calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 25th April to 30th May 2017

- 156 crimes recorded
- **86** undetected
- 70 detected

Detection rate **55%**, with a large number of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.

- 21st May, male victim of a homosexual hate crime in Gaberston Avenue,
 Alloa male responsible traced and charged accordingly
- 22nd May, male victim of Robbery in Engelen Drive, Alloa male responsible traced and charged accordingly
- Incidents on 30th April/4th May/5th May within Engelen Drive and surrounding streets in relation to Vandalisms and Disorderly behaviour – male identified as responsible for all incidents and duly charged accordingly.

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Facebook and Twitter – Community Messages can be placed on local Police sites via Community Sergeant.

Additional patrols and high visibility police presence at Alloa Police Office and town centre were undertaken after tragic events in Manchester last week and the increased threat level as a result of this.

Local Council elections took place in voting stations around Alloa, this passed without incident.

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue. Additional patrols being conducted and significant number of tickets issued, although numbers of vehicles appear to be reducing. Police enforcement to continue for the foreseeable future
