## CALLS TO POLICE

During period 25<sup>th</sup> April to 27<sup>th</sup> June 2017, PSoS received **1441** calls to incidents in Alloa;

- Beat A01 256 calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 609 calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 **341** calls for town centre
- Beat A04 235 calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

### RECORDED CRIME

During period 25<sup>th</sup> April to 27<sup>th</sup> June 2017

- **272** crimes recorded
- 134 undetected
- 138 detected

Detection rate **49%**, with a large number of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.

Incidents of note;



- 26<sup>th</sup> April male victim of a serious assault in Whins Road, Alloa. Male responsible traced and charged accordingly.
- 28<sup>th</sup> April female victim of a robbery in Woodburn Drive, Alloa. Male responsible traced and charged accordingly.
- 29<sup>th</sup> April male victim of a serious assault in Parliament Way, Alloa. Male responsible traced and charged accordingly.
- Incidents on 30<sup>th</sup> April/4<sup>th</sup> May/5<sup>th</sup> May, within Engelen Drive and surrounding streets in relation to vandalisms and disorderly behaviour. Male identified as responsible for all incidents and duly charged accordingly.
- 21st May, male victim of a homosexual hate crime in Gaberston Avenue, Alloa. Male responsible traced and charged accordingly.
- 22<sup>nd</sup> May, male victim of robbery in Engelen Drive, Alloa. Male responsible traced, charged accordingly and currently remanded in custody.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> June, well known male was released from court and then committed numerous thefts in Alloa. Male traced and has recently been sentenced to 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> months in prison.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 3 males charged with attempted murder in relation to an incident in Hawkhill Road. Males reported to PF and currently remanded in custody.
- 5<sup>th</sup> June, a 61 year old female was charged after shouting racial abuse at a group of Polish children.
- 12<sup>th</sup> June, local male caught with a significant number of illegal Valium tablets. His home address was searched and the male will be reported in due course.
- 14<sup>th</sup> June, Alloa Angling Shop, Drysdale Street, was broken into and 2 crossbows stolen from the display at front window. Positive lines of enquiry currently being followed.
- 25<sup>th</sup> June, 38 year old male, who has recently come to Police attention on several occasions, was found in the grounds of Inglewood House, in

possession of controlled drugs, indicating that he was concerned in the supply of drugs. Report being submitted to PF.

### **ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES**

Facebook and Twitter – Community Messages can be placed on local Police sites via Community Sergeant.

Additional patrols and high visibility Police around Alloa have been undertaken after tragic events throughout UK and the increased threat level as a result of this.

Local and national elections took place in voting stations around Alloa, this passed without incident.

Policing 2026 is a collaborative and strategic programme of work being driven by the SPA and Police Scotland that aims to transform the police service incrementally over the next 10 years. More information contained on the Police Scotland website.

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue. Additional patrols being conducted and significant number of tickets issued, although numbers of vehicles appear to be reducing. Police enforcement to continue for the foreseeable future.

On **Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> July**, Alloa, will host the annual Central Scotland Orange Walk, with 8000 band members expected and a similar number of spectators. There will be a number of road closures (details should be on council web page), with significant traffic disruption during the parade. Police / partner agencies have plans in place to hopefully prevent any disruption during the parade.
