CALLS TO POLICE

During period 27th June to 29th August 2017, PSoS received **1481** calls to incidents in Alloa;

- Beat A01 – **245** calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 – **566** calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 – **395** calls for town centre
- Beat A04 – **275** calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 27th June to 29th August 2017

- **273** crimes recorded
- **115** undetected
- **158** detected

Detection rate **58%**, with a large number of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.

Incidents of note;



On 29/06/17 male traced in Mar Place in possession of knives and an imitation firearm, public not at risk from this incident, items were not presented in any way by male. Items recovered and male charged with relevant offences.

On 01/07/17 male arrested for threatening and abusive behaviour in Katrine Court and Maple Court, traced in possession of knife and arrested for relevant offences.

On 02/07/17 male traced and arrested for threatening and abusive behaviour in Maple Court, traced in possession of knife and arrested for relevant offences.

On 05/07/17 male arrested for acting in a racially aggravated manner towards his neighbours in Dunvegan Court, charged and reported for relevant offence.

On 13/07/17 father and son involved in fight, during which son was stabbed (non-fatal) both parties traced and father arrested for relevant offence.

On 25/07/17 drugs warrant executed in Maple Court and controlled drugs recovered indicating occupant was supplying same. Male traced and charged with relevant offences.

On 04/08/17 female arrested in Argyl Street, drunk and in possession of knives, no persons injured and female charged accordingly.

On 05/08/17 male traced in possession of controlled drugs in Shillinghill, the amount of which indicating he was supplying same, subsequently arrested and reported for the relevant offences.

On 16/08/17 male presented imitation firearm in shop at Mentieth Court in an attempted robbery. Traced and arrested quickly after initial report, no persons injured as a result of this incident.

On 22/08/17 cannabis cultivation and large quantity of controlled drugs, totalling over £30,000 recovered after drugs warrant executed in Gordon Drive, Alloa. Occupant charged with the relevant offences.

On 22/08/17 male acting in a racially aggravated manner, whilst being abusive and threatening to staff at a takeaway in Shillinghill, traced and charged with relevant offences.

On 25/08/17 male and female reported to have threatened members of public whilst in possession of swords in Maple Court. Both traced quickly after incident



reported, swords recovered and both charged with relevant offences, no persons injured during the incident.

Between 03/08/17 and 19/08/17 female identified as responsible for multiple Thefts from houses and motor vehicles in the Alloa area, amounting to 9 separate charges, property recovered which will be returned to respective owners in due course.

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue. Additional patrols being conducted and significant number of tickets issued, although numbers of vehicles appear to be reducing. Police enforcement to continue for the foreseeable future.

On **Saturday 8th July**, Alloa, hosted the annual Central Scotland Orange Walk, with over 8000 band members and spectators attended. Event passed without incident and minimum disruption to local businesses and roads.

Local schools are returning after the summer break, community team will be making efforts to show an initial presence with a view to eliminating the annual parking issues in and around various schools.
