CALLS TO POLICE

During period 1st January 2018 to 29th January 2018, PSOS received 513 calls to incidents in Alloa;

- Beat A01 76 calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 177 calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 **128** calls for town centre
- Beat A04 **132** calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 1 January 2018 to 29th January 2018

- **70** crimes recorded
- **41** undetected
- 29 detected

Detection rate 42%, with 90% of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.

Incidents of note that are currently undetected;

 11/01/2018 – Vandalism to Alloa Tower, whereby stone pinnacles on pillars were smashed.

NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED



- 21/01/2018 Vandalism to Co-Op Bowling Club, Sunnyside Road, whereby a window was smashed.
- 26/01/2018 Culpable & Reckless Conduct, at Shillinghill, Alloa, whereby a car was damaged by a glass bottle whilst driving.

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

ASBO still in force for a 16 year old male who has been responsible for antisocial behaviour in and around the Gaberston Avenue/Lambert Terrace/ Springfield Road area, whereby he can no longer enter these streets.

Male resident within Shaftesbury Street who was subject of an ASBO was arrested on a number of occasions within a nine day period which resulted in him being remanded in custody.

On 16th January 2018, an incident occurred within a charity shop in High Street, Alloa which was heavily featured in the media. This resulted in a police officer being injured and a male being arrested for various acts of disorder. He was thereafter remanded in custody after appearance at Alloa Sheriff Court. There was no risk to the public during this incident.

Additional patrols have been conducted in Alloa town centre, to deter anti-social behaviour and drug/alcohol misuse especially around Shillinghill. This is prevalent on Friday/Saturday evenings with a large number of youths congregating. Work is ongoing with Youth Justice to create diversionary groups or resources to combat ASB and youth issues.

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue. Additional patrols being conducted and tickets being issued. Police enforcement to continue for the foreseeable future.

There have been 3 Misuse of Drugs search warrants that have been executed in the Alloa area and have been positive. With a substantial amount of drugs and money seized.
