CALLS TO POLICE

During period 26th January 2016, to 22nd February 2016, PSoS received 421 calls to incidents in Alloa:

Beat A01 – 84 calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.

Beat A02 – 139 calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan

Beat A03 – 116 calls for town centre

Beat A04 – 82 calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all call result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 26th January 2016, to 22nd February 2016,

130 crimes recorded

63 undetected

67 detected, including 14 road traffic offences.

Detection rate 51%

15 domestic related incidents.

2 hate related incidents. – including offence at Alloa v Rangers.

On 30th January 2016, Robbery reported in Harris Court, Alloa – mobile phone stolen from 15 year old male after threats, no weapon seen, 20 year old male arrested and remanded in custody.

6 recorded crimes related to alcohol- including robbery reported.

5 drug related crimes recorded. Recovery £1,500 illegal drugs and a local male and female reported.

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Facebook and Twitter – Community Messages can be placed on local Police sites via Community Sergeant.

Issues in Alloa town Centre re youths causing nuisance value and anti-social behavior, youths have been identified and spoken to on several occasions by Neale and Iain, leading to several charges being preferred and two of the youths being placed into temporary care through liaising with Clacks Social Work. Volume of calls to town Centre have dropped considerably and work will continue to engage with and disrupt youths whilst in town centre.

Parking Alloa Town Centre. Due to Traffic Wardens no longer being employed locally there has been a significate increase in the number of drivers parking (abandoning) their vehicles on double yellow lines, disabled parking bays and taxi ranks around town center. Iain and Neale are more than aware of the issues and when available will conduct enforcement by issuing parking tickets. Consideration for Community Council to maybe raise issue with Council to employ a Traffic Warden.
