CALLS TO POLICE

During period 28th May 2018 to 26th June 2018, PSOS received 584 calls to incidents in Alloa, as below;

- Beat A01 – **91** calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 – **238** calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 – **147** calls for town centre
- Beat A04 – **108** calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 28th May 2018 to 26th June 2018;

- **105** crimes recorded
- **57** undetected
- **48** detected

Detection rate 45%, with 93% of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.



COMMUNITY ISSUES

Additional patrols have been conducted in Alloa town centre, to deter anti-social behaviour and drug/alcohol misuse especially around Shillinghill and Forth Valley College. This is prevalent on Friday/Saturday evenings with a large number of youths congregating.

There has been 6 persons reported for Drugs Offences.

There has been 2 knife related crimes in Alloa in the last month. This are detected with two males reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

Community Speed Watch – This was an initiative run by Norfolk Constabulary a number of years ago, which was then piloted and trailed by Fife Division of Police Scotland. This involves members of the community attending at pre-determined, risk assessed sites with a speed detection device and monitoring traffic, noting down details of offending vehicles. The registered keeper of the vehicle thereafter receives a letter via the Police Service advising them of the circumstances. The deployments are supported by signage and media and are by their very nature high visibility with a clear deterrent effect. Training of volunteers in the use of speed detection equipment will be provided along with conflict management and personal safety training. This is a great opportunity for community empowerment through collaborative working, allowing members of the community to get actively involved in the issues they see daily in their areas and allow them to take positive action in respect of these issues. We are actively looking for volunteers in the Alloa area who would be interested in taking part in this initiative for a pilot period over the summer months.
