CALLS TO POLICE

During period 28th June to 30th August 2016, PSoS received 1078 calls to incidents in Alloa;

Beat A01 – 199 calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
Beat A02 – 464 calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
Beat A03 – 224 calls for town centre
Beat A04 – 191 calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 28th June to 30th August 2016,

273 crimes recorded
109 undetected
164 detected

Detection rate 60%, large number marked as undetected incidents have enquiries still ongoing.

8th July, 2 males entered a local taxi and attempted to rob the driver of money. Males quickly identified and traced. No one injured.

Over the past few months a number of cars/sheds have been broken into and property stolen. Enquiries are still ongoing in relation to a number of these. 2 males identified and reported.

23rd July, serious sexual assault took place at a local hotel. Suspect quickly identified and traced. Enquiries ongoing.



24th August, a male committed a robbery at Bridge Terrace. Male traced and currently remanded in custody. No person injured.

29th August, male in the company of others publically exposed himself in the area of Bedford Court. Enquiry ongoing to trace these persons.

Recent increase in items being stolen from gardens. Garden bench stolen from an address in Ashley Terrace.

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Facebook and Twitter – Community Messages can be placed on local Police sites via Community Sergeant.

Schools returned last week. Already parking issues reported at Redwell Primary School.

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue, although volume of parking tickets issued by police has significantly reduced. Double yellow lines still require to be refreshed at the Shillinghill area and disabled bays with clear road markings and signs on pavement. – Hopefully this will take place, as promised, after current road works complete.

Skate Park near Bowmar Centre, Alloa, well attended by local youths, calls still being received in relation to youths drinking. Park continues to be monitored between police and community wardens.

Locally 2 ongoing drugs operations and a further positive drugs search warrant executed today. Further to this there have been a number of drug related deaths locally, specific operation currently overseeing.

The community team continue to conduct regular patrols of the town centre to disrupt and dissuade those in the town from committing crime. Proactive patrols conducted on 25th August, number of parking tickets issued and persons searched.

On 29th August, I attended a local meeting with Neighbourhood Networks - www.neighbourhoodnetworks.org – who are looking to establish a new network within one of the local communities in Alloa. Further updates to follow.
