CALLS TO POLICE

During period 28th February to 28th March 2017, PSoS received **560** calls to incidents in Alloa;

- Beat A01 – **138** calls received for area leading from town towards Cambus.
- Beat A02 – **188** calls received for area behind Tesco out towards Clackmannan
- Beat A03 – **142** calls for town centre
- Beat A04 – **92** calls received for area leading out towards Tullibody

Calls range from public looking for advice from Police, member of the public reporting drug related issues, disturbance, road traffic offences and concern for person. Not all calls result in a report(s) having to be submitted.

34 calls to old St Johns Primary, Grange Road. Developer contacted and building further secured. Additional patrols being conducted when possible. Social media posts.

RECORDED CRIME

During period 28th February to 28th March 2017

- **100** crimes recorded
- **53** undetected
- **47** detected



Detection rate **47%**, with a large number of undetected incidents marked as having enquiries still ongoing.

Incidents of note;

- 3rd March, male robbed in Hillside Terrace. Accused traced and currently remanded in custody.
- 6th March, a resident in Rose Street, was remanded in custody after causing further anti-social behaviour towards his neighbours. Person awaiting trial in April.
- 6th March, a number of letters were received at a local MSP office and council buildings which were threatening and abusive. Enquiries still ongoing with a number of lines of enquiry being made.
- 16th March, whilst Police searching an address in Hillview Terrace, for drugs 4 air weapons were recovered and a male reported to the Procurator Fiscal.
- 18th March, a 14 year old male has been referred to The Reporters to the Childrens panel after being charged in relation to supplying drugs.
- Over same period 6 detected drugs cases.
- 21 vandalisms reported over period with 2 detected and enquiries still ongoing in relation to others. These with others are being reviewed to establish any connection and trying to identify suspect(s).

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Facebook and Twitter – Community Messages can be placed on local Police sites via Community Sergeant.

Additional patrols being undertaken after tragic events in London, last week. Attached information for members of the public (please circulate).

SDL protest and counter protest on 11th March, passed without incident.

Parking in town centre still continues to be an ongoing issue. Additional patrols being conducted and significant number of tickets issued, although numbers of vehicles appear to be reducing. Police enforcement to continue for the foreseeable future.

Skate Park near Bowmar Centre, Alloa, lights repaired, however due to weather and unknown other issues youths appear not to be using it as much as previous.

E-mail and phone scams still ongoing, increasing use of I-Tune vouchers.
