About the Alloa Matters process

Alloa Matters is a Participatory Budgeting exercise. Alloa Community Council have secured £4,000 that is to be distributed to local groups through a participatory process which actively involves residents.

Through it, local people decide which Projects they feel will benefit them and exercise the power to allocate funds to those Projects.

Residents will make the decisions on the allocation of funds will be made at a Decision Event which is to be held at Alloa Town Hall on Saturday 20th January 2018. All eligible Projects will be presented to local people for their consideration at this event.

As with most grant funding, not all applications will be successful, and successful applications may only receive part of the amount they applied for, depending on how many applications are received and how much they are for. It is a condition of this grant that groups must attend the event at Alloa Town Hall to promote their application.

About Alloa Matters Funding

Alloa Matters funding is suitable for your Project if it can benefit the Alloa community by doing one or more of the following:-

- bringing land and buildings
- helping to get people active in their community.
- Making the green enrionment more attractive
- Improving community safety
- supporting local social and recreational activities
- *helping people learn together*
- benefiting disadvantaged local people, or those who have special needs because of disability, their gender or the ethnic/racial group to which they belong

Alloa Matters will not fund:

- Political Parties or activities which promote Party politics
- Activities which promote religion
- Organisation running costs such as salaries and overheads
- Projects on a retrospective basis

Important information before you begin:-

- i. You must be able to complete your Project by 31st March 2018. Your Project cannot start before the Alloa Town Hall Event on Saturday 20th January 2018.
- ii. Your Project must be located in and directly benefit people within the Alloa Community Council boundary.
- iii. Maximum grant is £500. Project can be for more than that but evidence is required to show other funds are available.
- iv. It must be 'not-for-profit'.
- v. You must be able to attend the Alloa Town Hall Event, if eligible, otherwise your project cannot be considered.
- vi. Match funding is not required but may help get you more votes from the public.
- vii. Provide publicity material to promote your application that will be used on social media.
- viii. You must provide us with feedback upon completion of your Project, if successful.

Please read the guidance in full before you complete the application form.

The deadline for applications is 17th November 2017. Completed applications can be handed in to the Spiers Centre, to Alloa Community Council members or to Kilncraigs Reception of Clackmannanshire Council.
