An afternoon car share visit to tour the site of the historic spring water source for Shrewsbury, and the Shropshire Beekeepers Apiary.

Today Conduit Head is a Grade 2 16th Century building built in 1578 and made of red sand stone with timber framed trusses and nine associated wells. The water



system, owned and operated by the Corporation, remained in use until 1947.

In 2018 Shropshire Beekeepers' Association acquired the site from Shropshire County Council on the basis of a long lease. SBKA through a team of Volunteers is transforming the historic site into the Apiary and Wildlife Visitor Centre.

HOLIDAY 2020 - THE CASTLES AND HERITAGE OF CARDIFF

The holiday departing on 7th June 2020 will be for four nights on a half board basis at the 4* Clayton Hotel, ten minutes walk from Cardiff Castle. All rooms are en-suite with TV, telephone, hair dryer and tea and coffee making facilities.

Day 2 - we meet our Blue Badge guide and have a morning guided tour of Cardiff to include visiting he National Assembly building, the Wales Millennium Centre. In the afternoon we visit the Royal Mint.

Day 3 - with the Blue Badge guide we visit Castell Cochairs, the Red Castle, a medieval castle with a surprising interior. In the afternoon we return to Cardiff for the National Museum of Wales. Our guided introductory tour takes us through Wales and across the world, including one of the best collections of Impressionist works outside Paris.





Day 4 - takes us to Cardiff Castle for a guided tour with our Blue Badge guide. We then travel to the Museum of Welsh Life in St Fagan's and then return to Cardiff for the rest of the day.

Day 5 - after checking out of the hotel, we will visit Lacock Abbey, Fox Talbot Museum near Bath. Some of the itinerary may change.

The cost of the holiday is **£579** with a single

supplement of £99. Insurance if you need it is £24. Tailored Travel's insurance has an upper age limit of 85. This is not generally needed in this country, but it does give you cover in case of unexpected cancellations. NT properties are free to members, but other visits will be extra.

I am pleased to offer members this wonderful insight into Broseley, its fascinating history and the important contribution Broseley made to the Industrial Revolution with its manufacture of iron, bricks, roofing, wall and floor tiles, art pottery and clay tobacco pipes.

The Pipe Works Museum, which is being opened especially for our visit, is a unique time capsule of an industry which few people even know existed, but carried the name of Broseley throughout Britain and beyond. We will start our day with a talk and guided tour of the small but interesting Pipe Works. Leaving the museum around 11.00 am, Steve Dewhirst will take us on a walking tour of the Broseley Wood area and its Jitties. 'The Jitties' are a maze of narrow lanes and passageways that link up around a higgledy-piggledy mix of old squatter cottages, with plenty of history to be shared.

Optional: Leaving Broseley around 1.00/1.30 pm., a short drive takes us to Benthall Hall NT (Postcode: TF12 5RX) where you may wish to enjoy a light lunch (limited menu, mainly sandwiches) cakes or afternoon tea. ATTINGHAM WALK 10 October 2019

A dozen members assembled at Attingham for a walk with Colin Morris, the Area Ranger. It was a fine (and dry!) day.

Colin took us through the deer park and gave us a fascinating insight into how the herd is managed and how the deer live within the park. He also explained how carefully the condition of the trees is regularly monitored and controlled, and how records are kept by each tree having an identification number.

We continued through the woods to the area not accessible to the public, and to the buildings where timber is converted to chippings for the Biomass plant. We were now close to the Atcham Industrial Estate (not owned by the NT) and we

saw the old WW2 motor transport repair shed on the site of the airfield where the United States Airforce trained fighter pilots. The main runway is clearly visible within surrounding agricultural land and Colin told us



how the crops on this land are harvested and distributed.



We then walked to Smethcote Farm where Colin explained how one of the redundant farm buildings is to be converted to a pair of holiday cottages as part of the long term plans for the estate. We returned to the start along the permissive path to Upton Forge, the suspension bridge and the path past the walled garden.

We appreciated Colin's enthusiasm

about all matters to do with Attingham and we were very impressed by the width of his knowledge. We were most grateful to him for a really interesting and instructive morning.

Minutes of the 47th Annual General Meeting of the Shropshire National Trust Centre held at Prestfelde School Shrewsbury Wednesday 17 April 2019

Miss Foster, Chairman, opened the meeting by welcoming members and our President Mr David Brown.

- 1. Apologies were received from six members.
- 2. Minutes of the 46th AGM held on 12 April 2018, were accepted by the members as a true record. **Proposed by Gerald Hume, Seconded by Daphne Jones.**
- 3. Matters arising. None
- 4. **Chairman's Report:** We started the year with a new membership secretary and newsletter editor which has also brought some changes. The membership email address has changed and access to the website improved with help from regional office. Apart from the usual twice yearly newsletter we now have set up an email system which will slowly grow and allow us to keep more up to date with information.

We have had a good range of lectures over the year. These have included Carl Faberge in September, the Best of Shropshire, Pine Martins, The Berwick's in Italy, Well Dressing and Aristocrats of the Air. The Much Wenlock guided tour was excellent and a good number joined the visit to the Victorian Christmas Fayre.

The Increase fees was not popular and the committee decided it is time to increase the membership fee to offset the increase in general running cost. It will then be possible to adjust the lecture fee.

We have tried for some time to re-instate the lecture programme during the day. This was looked into by several committee members who went looking for a suitable venue. It was a difficult task and one which resulted in the decision to change it to a day time slot and to consider it again after one year. Running a day as well as an evening lecture programme is not possible with the present small committee.

The walks programme has produced a range of excellent visits and walks and has given a boost to the summer activates on offer. There is a good group going on the Sussex holiday which will help raise mush needed funds.

The centre has been in consultation with a group at Attingham Park/Sunnycroft to discuss fund raising issues and possible events. It is hoped that this will increase the variety of events we are able to provide for members.

We have had two good newsletters from our new editor and the facility to collect the membership card from the Autumn issue is a bonus. Please look at the website and give your comments to Les Jones. We would like comments on things you would like to do so please do talk to us. Thank you to the committee for all their hard work and support over the year.
